District 91 Notes for Contestant Briefing: "Face to Face" Contest Edition

Conducted by: Contest Chair

When: Immediately before the contest.

Attendees: Contestants, Timekeepers

Before the Contestant Briefing

- 1. Contest Chair aims to obtain signed copies of the following from the contestants
 - Speaker's Eligibility & Originality
 - Speaker Profile (no signature required)
- 2. Contest Chair asks the Contestants if they have any disability or sensory impairment that needs to be taken into account, e.g. blindness, colour blindness.
- 3. For International and Humorous Speech contests, the Contest Chair must ensure that the Speakers have sent their speech titles before the Briefing.
- 4. Ensure all forms required for the contest have been printed Eligibility and Originality forms, 1st, 2nd and 3rd place certificates and Certificates of Participation
- 5. Retrieve any trophies from the previous year's winners.
- 6. Communicate the time of the briefing to the contestants

Contestant Briefing

Arrival

- 1. Verify that all contestants are present
- 2. Check the pronunciation of all contestant's names
- 3. Ensure all speakers have read and understood the Speaker's Certification of Eligibility and Originality and collect and remaining forms.

Stage Area

- 1. Acquaint contestants with the exact speaking area, such as lectern, tables, lighting, microphone, etc.
- 2. Indicate the space (typically at the back of the room) where you would like the contestants to wait prior to their being introduced to the stage.
- 3. Indicate the location of the timing signals and asks the Timekeepers to demonstrate them in use
 - a) Any visually impaired contestant is permitted to request a warning signal of his or her own choosing. This might be a person announcing the time at five, six and seven minutes for example.

Contest Procedure and Timing of the Speeches

International and Humorous Speech Contests

- 1. You will Introduce each contestant by announcing "Our next Speaker is [Firstname Lastname] [speech title] [Firstname Lastname!]"
- 2. The speaker should begin speaking within a short time after arriving at the speaking area and is not permitted to delay the contest unnecessarily
- 3. Timing will begin with the contestant's first definite verbal or nonverbal communication with the audience
- 4. International and Humorous Speeches shall be from five (5) to seven (7) minutes.
- 5. A Contestant will be disqualified if the speech is less than four (4) minutes 30 seconds or more than seven (7) minutes 30 seconds.
- 6. Time Signalling
 - a. A green signal will be displayed at five (5) minutes and remain displayed for one minute.
 - b. A yellow signal will be displayed at six (6) minutes and remain displayed for one minute.
 - c. A red signal will be displayed at seven (7) minutes and will remain on until the conclusion of the speech.
- 7. There will be no indication to the Contestant that they have gone over time, i.e. banging a gavel, waving cards, etc.
- 8. At the conclusion of each speech and during the one minutes silence for the judges to vote.

Table Topics Contest

- 1. All contestants will receive the same topic and will receive no advance knowledge of the topic until the moment they are introduced to the stage.
- 1. When the contest begins, all contestants except the first shall leave the room and remain out of earshot under the supervision of the contest Sergeant at Arms.
- 2. You will Introduce each contestant by announcing "[Firstname Lastname] [topic] [topic] [Firstname Lastname!]"
- 3. The speaker should begin speaking within a short time after arriving at the speaking area and is not permitted to delay the contest unnecessarily
- 4. Timing will begin with the contestant's first definite verbal or nonverbal communication with the audience
- 5. Table Topics Speeches shall be from one (1) to two (2) minutes.
- 6. A Contestant will be disqualified if the speech is less than one (1) minute or more than two (2) minutes 30 seconds.
- 7. There will be no indication to the Contestant that they have gone over time, i.e. banging a gavel, waving cards, etc.
- 8. Time Signalling
 - a. A green signal will be displayed at one (1) minute and remain displayed for 30 seconds.
 - b. A yellow signal will be displayed at one (1) minute 30 seconds and remain displayed for 30 seconds.
 - c. A red signal will be displayed at two (2) minutes and will remain on until the conclusion of the speech.
- 9. There will be no indication to the Contestant that they have gone over time, i.e. banging a gavel, waving cards, etc.
- 10. At the conclusion of each speech and during the one minutes silence for the judges to vote, the next speaker shall be invited into the room.

Evaluation Contest

- 1. At the beginning of this contest, a five-to seven-minute test speech will be presented.
- 2. The speaker's identity will remain unknown to the contestants until they are introduced to deliver their speech.
- 3. Contestants are permitted to make preparatory notes during the test speech ONLY using the supplied 'Evaluation Contestant Notes' sheets.
- 4. Neither the manual project nor any objectives that the speaker may have will be made known
- 5. At the conclusion of the test speech, all contestants will leave the room and taken by the Sergeant at Arms to (give location).
- 6. Contestants then have five minutes to prepare their evaluation using the supplied sheets
- 7. After five minutes have elapsed, no further preparation shall be allowed
- 8. All note sheets must be given to the contest Sergeant at Arms.
- 9. The notes sheets will be handed back to each contestant as they are introduced to present their evaluation.
- 10. You will Introduce each contestant by announcing "[Firstname Lastname] [Firstname Lastname]"
- 11. The speaker should begin speaking within a short time after arriving at the speaking area and is not permitted to delay the contest unnecessarily
- 12. Timing will begin with the contestant's first definite verbal or nonverbal communication with the audience
- 13. Evaluation Speeches shall be from two (2) to three (3) minutes.
- 14. A Contestant will be disqualified if the speech is less than two (2) minutes or more than three (3) minutes 30 seconds.
- 15. There will be no indication to the Contestant that they have gone over time, i.e. banging a gavel, waving cards, etc.
- 16. Time Signalling
 - a. A green signal will be displayed at two (2) minutes and remain displayed for 30 seconds.
 - b. A yellow signal will be displayed at two (2) minutes 30 seconds and remain displayed for 30 seconds.
 - c. A red signal will be displayed at (3) minutes and will remain on until the conclusion of the speech.
- 17. There will be no indication to the Contestant that they have gone over time, i.e. banging a gavel, waving cards, etc.
- 18. At the conclusion of each speech and during the one minutes silence for the judges to vote, the next speaker shall be invited into the room.

After the Final Speaker

- 1. Contest Chair requests "Silence please" and maintains the silence for as long as the Judges need to complete their ballots.
- 2. Contest Chair "hands out" Contestant certificates in speaking order.
- 3. Contest Chair performs Contestant interviews for about 2 minutes per Contestant.
- 4. After the Contestant interviews, there may be other audience entertainment until the ballots are counted.
- 5. Announcement of the Winners:
 - a. Prior to announcing the contest results, the Chief Judge will announce if any time disqualifications occurred, but not name the Contestant(s) involved.
 - b. The Chief Judge will announce the results.

Protests

Contestants can raise protests based on Originality or Eligibility or for referencing another competitor's speech. **New 2020/21 rule:** "Contestants must not reference another Contestant, or a speech presented by another Contestant, from the platform at the same contest in which they are competing".

Should you wish to lodge a protest you should speak to the Chief Judge **after** the speeches have **concluded** and before announcement of the results.

Drawing the Speaking Order

- a) Contest Chair and Contestants draw the speaking order at the Briefing e.g. from a bag of folded numbered slips.
- b) Record each contestant's name and speech title in the order drawn
